### **FROM THE BOOKSTORE MANAGER**

The book bill is a list of all the fees for each class your child takes as well as any additional fees not included in tuition. A book bill is prepared each year your child attends St. Frances. Occasionally, students may receive textbooks from students who have graduated from St. Frances. In this case, the student needs to inform Ms. Stanley, so that their book bill can be adjusted.

Even if a student receives all of the textbooks they need for class, there are still additional fees that are charged each year. These fees are listed on the book bill and the balance needs to be paid in full in order for the child to continue at St. Frances.

The first quarter will come to a close on November 2, 2007. If you still have a balance remaining on your child's book bill, please make sure that the bill is paid by then to prevent any administrative actions. You can bring the payment to the main office or send it by your child. You can pay in cash, check or money order.

## ADDITIONAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

### FROM THE SCHOOL BASED HEALTH CLINIC

- ◆ October has been a busy month for the Center. All students were measured and weighed and were given their BMI (Body Mass Index) which tells them if they are on target for healthy weight. Any student not in the healthy category was given the appropriate information to help him/her achieve a safer weight. The obesity epidemic in the US has contributed to many youth developing high blood pressure and diabetes before they graduate from high school.
- ◆ Students also had vision screens. Those students who failed were given referrals to have more complete vision exams. Those students who have glasses but were not wearing them were encouraged to do so.
- ◆ Hadassa presented a program on breast self examination to the junior and senior girls.
- ◆ In November all students will receive tobacco education and the city will provide a tour of the Smoke Free Bus.
- ◆ Plans are underway to have a flu shot clinic in early November...more information later.

Send in your application (paper or preferably online), application fee (you may get 4 fee waivers if you receive free or reduced lunch), college essay, recommendation letters, SAT scores and your high school transcript. Make sure to read the directions on the applications thoroughly and completely and note application deadline dates. Each school will have its own requirements for admissions.**
4. **Visit each school to see if it is a good fit for you. While there, get an interview and a tour. Make a positive impression!**
5. **All college applications should be submitted before the Christmas break.**
6. **If your Quarter 1 grades are good, send a copy to each college; it will help them make an admissions decision!**
7. **Apply for scholarships!! Go to our website or visit the guidance office. [www.sfacademy.org/programs/guidance/collegeopportunity.php](http://www.sfacademy.org/programs/guidance/collegeopportunity.php).**

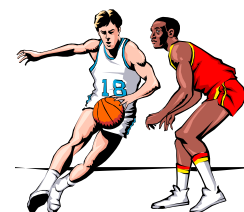
